The Royal Tenenbaums (2001)



Dysfunctional families are probably the most interesting thing to watch (that's why bad reality shows are so popular). They're caustic, and we like seeing them but are too afraid to take part in their drama. One of the best dysfunctional families audiences so enjoy seeing crash and burn are the Tenenbaums.

"The Royal Tenenbaums" is a highlight of director Wes Anderson's career. Anderson manages to use to sly bits of comedy appropriately in a dramatic story, making it light but still dark, funny yet still sad. Every character, from the chain-smoking Margot [Gwenyth Paltrow], to the lovably odd Richie [Luke Wilson] (HE OWNS A FALCON AND PLAYS TENNIS!!!!!) is, no matter how unusual, completely relatable and irresistibly adorable.

The Truman Show (1998)

Unfortunately, for Truman [Jim Car-

Through his secret plan to escape Truman meets a girl who tries to save him (and gets kicked off the show). He even learns more about his father who, on the show, "died", but later reappeared on set by accident.

The whole concept of "The Truman Show" is creepy enough to make one interested. It's a slightly disturbing but definitely entertaining tale of discovery, and it's plot is gripping during the entirety of the film.
